PSYCHOSTIMULANT RECOVERY PEER ADVOCATE

REPORTING RELATIONSHIP: Under the supervision of the Assistant Director of Recovery Services and/or designee.

JOB SUMMARY: The Psychostimulant Recovery Peer Advocate assists in the development and monitoring of the recovery systems of UConnectCare (formerly known as GCASA). They will demonstrate relevant, competent knowledge and skills in the area of providing one-on-one recovery services and support to individuals. In addition, they will provide linkage with other service providers in the community. As a Peer Advocate/ Recovery Coach, you will play a pivotal role in supporting individuals on their journey to recovery from psychostimulant's/ polysubstance addiction in the rural service area of Genesee and Orleans counties.

1. Contribute to the knowledge base of the agency and the profession by attending ongoing and up to date relevant trainings associated with recovery services. Provide consultation and training to UConnectCare staff and other providers.
2. Collaborate effectively within the multidisciplinary team, including clinicians, prevention educators, coordinators, medical professionals, peer advocates and social workers, to ensure comprehensive care for clients.
3. Contribute to a collaborative and supportive team culture that prioritizes the well-being and recovery of individuals being served and the community.
4. Develop collaborative relationships and provide liaison services between individuals, UConnectCare, and other necessary services in the community.
5. Work within the framework of UConnectCare's recovery services to help individuals develop recovery plans, learn and practice new skills, and self-monitor their progress.
6. Assist individuals with navigation through various systems (i.e. legal, medical, mental health, SUD), attend court and other system meetings as a support and assist in advocating for effective services.
7. Foster a non-judgmental and empathetic environment for clients to share their experiences.
8. Model effective coping skills.
9. Attend training sessions and stay informed about the latest developments in addiction recovery.
10. Collect and report data regarding individuals receiving recovery services. Keep up to date records to ensure appropriate service delivery and reimbursement when applicable.
11. Will be required to participate in supplemental supervision meetings and/or professional development opportunities led by the supervisor, other leaders, other staff, and/or vendors.
12. This position requires (or may require) participation in Peer on-call.
13. Willing and able to achieve the Peer competencies as determined by SAMHSA, OASAS, and the NYS Certification Board.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: Must have a minimum of a high school diploma or jurisdictionally certified high school equivalency. Must have or be willing to obtain within the first six months of employment the Certified Recovery Peer Advocate (CRPA). Must have or be willing to obtain within the first six months of employment a knowledge base of psychostimulant recovery, treatment, and prevention best-practices. Preferred knowledge of community-based recovery services, chemical dependency counseling, Motivational Interviewing, and family systems. Ability to work independently and as part of a team. Compassion, patience, and a non-judgmental attitude. Valid NYS driver's license and method of transportation required. Scheduled work hours will be flexible to provide maximum coverage as needed and may vary accordingly to include weekdays, weekends, and/or evenings. Must be addiction free, including tobacco. Pre-employment background check/post offer drug screening required. This is an hourly nonexempt job. CARF and NHSC Accredited.

Rate of Pay: \$15-\$16 per hour. Hours per day or week 0.5 FTE based on a 35-hour work week.
